Honorable Chair Prozanski, Vice Chair Thatcher and Members of the Judiciary Committee,

My name is Janice Dysinger of Clean Voter Rolls, I testified last year on this idea. I am here today to put that into the record today.

Many victims of crime look to our Justice Department to bring some sort of justice to the place they find themselves after acts of violence. Nothing can change what happened and I don't believe any of them are looking for revenge. We just seek justice. I believe that if we want our society to be a civil society there must be justice brought when bad things happen. That is what I seek today.

My brother was murdered many years ago. He can no longer vote. That right along with his life were taken from us. Why should criminals serving their sentence be given a right to vote. Voting is a very sacred right in our country. It determines if we will be a free people or not.

So I ask you again today, please do not pass this bill. I am adding my testimony from last year to be put on the record as well.
