McMenamins has worked very hard over the years to ensure that musicians are well compensated and have the opportunity to perform in their venues. During the pandemic, it was through the herculean efforts of venues that we were able to maintain a presence. Because of that, we held on to our fan base and were able to sustain our business and artistic efforts without losing ground.

Throughout this time, we have watched so many of these beloved venues struggle with the challenges we all now face: higher costs and lower profit margins can create a disincentive to offer live music, and yet these venues are holding fast to their commitment to provide live music as a cultural imperative. So many people are eager to re-enter live performance spaces throughout Oregon, and so many bands and musicians are eager to offer our songs. A revival of boisterous, joyful performances is afoot, and preserving our stages is vitally important!

Please help our venues stay alive and begin to thrive again during this time of transition. It would be a shame to see them fail at this late stage in the pandemic. The lasting economic impact of closures over the last two and a half years is still being felt, and costs have risen by more than 20%.
