I'm a fourth generation Oregon resident and farmer residing in Yamhill County, Oregon. I am submitting my opposition to HJR 5, the proposed Oregon Constitutional amendment that would give special rights and privileges to hunters over that of all citizens that reside in Oregon and those that care about preserving our state's wildlife and public safety. With Oregon's ever dwindling wildlife habitat and protection of threatened animal species including those in Yamhill County, the general population in Oregon are taking notice and demanding to become more involved in the process of how our wildlife is treated and managed which has been a right all along through the voting process. If HJR 5 passes, this right of Oregon's citizens will be taken away. Regardless of one's personal views on hunting, all citizens of Oregon and not just a few, should have a say, and be allowed to vote on how our wildlife is treated and managed, whether hunting should be allowed in the area where they live, what laws should be added or amended, and that those important decisions not left to those who have an interest in hunting.
