The Legislative Assembly seeks to create an atmosphere in Oregon's public school system where research and development of new learning opportunities are actively pursued. The provisions of this chapter should be interpreted liberally to support the goals of this section and to advance a renewed commitment by this state to the mission, goals and diversity of public education. It is the intent that public charter schools may serve as models and catalysts for the improvement of other public school system."

You should be doing everything in your power to welcome charter schools and make it easier for them to prosper. Not the opposite. The fact some public schools may feel threaten is a healthy reminder to them that they need to improve.
