Chair Holvey and members of the House Committee on Business and Labor:

Disability Rights Oregon is writing in support of HB 2800. Age discrimination is a very real problem in Oregon. Age discrimination often is tied hand in hand with employers' negative bias against people with disabilities. Older workers are perceived as more likely to have serious health issues, unable to keep up with their younger co-workers or out of touch with current technology. All of these misconceptions lead to highly qualified people being screened out of the application process.

It is important to draw a hard line outlawing these types of discrimination based on stereotypes that have no merit. Each individual deserves to be considered on their own skills and experiences and not be categorically rejected. Seniors bring unique prospective and experiences to a work force and it is in everyone's best interest to stop these practices that are keeping high quality workers out of the work force.
