The 2021 Legislature made a historic investment in services to people with intellectual and developmental

disabilities (I/DD) and for the first time the I/DD system was FULLY FUNDED. Even though this investment

allowed us to increase wages for DSPs by \$1.25 an hour (current average reimbursement wage for DSPs at

\$17.81), providers still report an average DSP vacancy rate of 23%.

Additional increases in wages are needed to address the current workforce shortage. Per a recent ORA

survey, 85% of providers are no longer accepting referrals to serve new people and 86% have reduced

capacity or closed services and anticipate closing additional services.

DSPs deserve a living wage. Please support HB 2457.
