I oppose HB2107. Oregon has one of the worst voting systems in the US. We are laughing stock of the country. The current system has so many broken chain of custody problems and opaque boxes where everything is hidden. Stop using an electronic system to register, here's the info from the Oregon Secretary of state to vote. You don't have to prove you are a US citizen. You are told that providing incorrect information could be a felony, but heck, illegal immigrants already broke the law coming into this country - they don't care.

Qualifications to Register to Vote

To register to vote in Oregon, you must be:

- A U.S. citizen
- A resident of Oregon
- At least 16 years old

If you are not yet 18 years of age, you will not receive a ballot until an election occurs on or after your 18th birthday.

Nothing should be automatic. Nothing should be blindly mailed out. Nobody should ever be automatically registered to vote, ever.

If a person is eligible to vote, and they choose to vote, they need to fill out a voter registration card, follow the process, and show proof of citizenship.

We need stop mailing printed ballots, scanning ballots and using digital systems where data can be corrupted, changed, manipulated and machines can be hacked and data changed - what could possibly go wrong? Perhaps they find a memory card with lost votes, and it changes the election? Or votes are calculated by percentage of a vote.

We also need to vote on "election day", one day. Did you ever notice that the longer the window is open the more ballots are "found". And those ballots keep getting "found" until the corrupt candidate wins. When voting in person, on one day there will be no lost votes, only honest votes.

France votes in person, with paper ballots and hand counts those ballots on election day, why can't we? It's the only way to ensure voter transparency.
