I am writing in Opposition of HB 2107 for the following reasons:

 The <u>Oregon Health Authority</u> deals with <u>people's</u> physical and mental <u>health</u>. The <u>Oregon Health Plan</u>, provides <u>health coverage</u> for low-income people Both organizations hold people's sensitive, personal and private information. It would **violate HIPPA laws** for either organization to share personal information with the elections office.

It's the <u>Secretary of State's</u> responsibility for managing Oregon's <u>elections</u>

\* OHA & OHP must not provide personal data for registering people to vote.\*

• To collect digital images of people's signature is a gross violation of privacy.

• Using digital images of peoples' signatures, especially without their participation or permission, puts the people of this state at risk for *identity fraud*. There have already been multiple breaches of data at the state level.

• "No technical evidence exists that any internet voting technology is safe or can be made so in the foreseeable future; rather, all research performed to date demonstrates the opposite." <sup>1</sup>

For these reasons and more, I urge you to **VOTE NO on HB 2107**.
