HB3223 - Dental Assisting is a career that needs advancement opportunities. Don't deny that!

Currently there are *no certification, education or training requirements* for the basic level of Dental Assisting in Oregon. *Training can be obtained on the job per Oregon Board of Dentistry* Chapter 818 Division 42. Oregon Secretary of State Administrative Rules.

This means there are **NO BARRIERS to employment** for any person choosing to apply to a dental office to work and be trained as a dental assistant (DA).

There are **NO BARRIERS to hiring**; a dental office can hire ANYONE and train them to be a dental assistant..

The average age of a dental assistant is 37! Right now dental assisting is a stable, long-term **career**! https://www.zippia.com/dental-assistant-jobs/demographics/

Dental Assisting is **a CAREER not a JOB**. The healthcare field typically employs <u>lifelong</u> employees <u>that</u> <u>will become experts in their field</u>.

Removing certification requirements removes an opportunity to advance in the career of dental assisting. Already a career with <u>very limited upward mobility</u>, gaining expanded function certification <u>allows for advancement</u> in a long-term career.

Stripped of the opportunity to set themselves apart by advancing to becoming certified as an expanded function dental assistant. *This entry level career* in the dental field will be **demoted to a MINIMUM WAGE job**.

By testing for the Expanded Functions Dental Assistant (EFDA) certification, an employee shows employers that they encompass the attitude for growth, and have grit and strength of purpose. Certification provides a reliable validation of skills all dentists can be confident in.

Economic impact-Multnomah County:

\$48,780- Annual mean wage of an Oregon dental assistant.

-Oregon is one of the "Top paying states for dental assistants". Dental Assistants (bls.gov)

A full time dental assistant, supporting a three person household in Multnomah County earning the annual mean wage, qualifies in 2022 as Oregon Household Income Guidelines' -200% Federal Poverty Level. And they qualify for SNAP benefits. SNAP (food stamps) in Multnomah County | Multnomah County (multco.us)

\$46,276.- The per capita mean income level for one of the LARGEST counties in Oregon (Multnomah). Multnomah County Oregon Household Income | Department of Numbers (deptofnumbers.com)

Stripped of opportunity; *this entry level career* in the dental field will be **demoted to a MINIMUM WAGE job**. The number of **LIFE-LONG career** dental assistants **will decrease**.

This bill will not help the quantity of employees for jobs but instead will severely stunt the quality jobs available and applicants alike.

HB3223 Will continue fanning the flame of disparity between assistants and dentists.
