The "Text: [HB 3249]" states, "SECTION 3. ORS 759.425, as amended by section 3, chapter 17, Oregon Laws 2020 (first special session), is amended to read: 759.425. (1)(a) *The Public Utility Commission shall establish and implement a competitively neutral and nondiscriminatory universal service fund.* The commission shall: (A) Use the universal service fund to ensure basic telephone service is available at a reasonable and affordable rate[.]; and (B) *Transfer from the universal service fund* to the **Oregon Business Development Department for deposit in the Broadband Fund** established under section 4, chapter 17, Oregon Laws 2020 (first special session), an amount per year that is equal to the lesser of: (i) \$5 million; or (ii) The remainder of moneys deposited in the universal service fund that are unobligated after making the designation required in paragraph (b) of this subsection. (b) The commission shall designate the amount of moneys deposited under to be used to ensure basic telephone service. The amount designated under this paragraph may not exceed \$28 million per year."

Broadband FUND is a state funded entitlement.

Broadband is a consortium of corporate activities for profit.

Taxpayers should not be compelled by law to subsidize any parts of the Broadband projects.
