ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Students must be ethnically diverse and/or a Heritage Speaker of a language other than English
- Undergraduate students must be entering or already enrolled in the final two years of an approved Oregon preliminary teacher licensure program
- Graduate students can apply upon enrolling in, or if currently enrolled in, an approved Oregon preliminary teacher licensure program
- Colleges: Oregon four-year public and nonprofit only
- FAFSA/ORSAA: Required based on financial need
- Prior recipients may be eligible for one additional year depending on funding availability
- Residence (state): Oregon

AWARD CRITERA

- Awarded students must be accepted and enrolled in a State of Oregon approved preliminary teacher licensure program.
- Awarded students must attend an Oregon 4-year public or private nonprofit, postsecondary school offering an approved teacher licensure program.
- Renewal Requirements: Each student is required to attend one professional development conference and complete a Scholars Profile.
