To the Chairs of the Joint Committee on Semiconductors:

I would like to outline my objections to SB4 and the siting of a chip plant supersite in Wilsonville – specifically the current Langdon Farms Golf Club location.

I am not a NIMBY and understand the importance of locating a chip supersite in the area. However, the Langdon Farms Golf Club is not a feasible location for the following reasons:

- I-5 access to that area is already a major choke point during most of the day, except between 10am and 2pm. This window continues to narrow as more traffic uses I-5.
- The Oregon DOT is actively considering tolling on the I-5 Boone Bridge because the congestion is so bad.
- The direct access roads that currently go to Langdon Farms are two-lane roads (Miley Rd and Airport Rd NE) that would require a large infrastructure investment to accommodate the increased traffic.

Committee members, I invite you to actually drive this I-5 section of Wilsonville and the roads that go to Langdon Farms during the workday commuting hours. Then ask yourself:

- Do you feel that additional hundreds of cars each day could be accommodated?
- Is there a better site off I-5 that is not already congested that could be considered?

I am asking you to please remove Wilsonville from the siting of a chip plant supersite.
