Measure: SB803

ONRI oppose SB 803 for several reasons:

\*This bill would completely phase out petroleum diesel in 7 years with no plan to address the supply of renewable diesel.

\*During the reign of the supermajority, the sale of renewable diesel is already being incentivized through the Clean Fuels Program.

\*Under Kate Brown's Executive Order 20-04 during COVID but this has nothing to do with Covid, the Environmental Quality Commission (EQC) adopted the Climate Protection Program (cap-and-reduce) that creates a preference for fuels like renewable diesel.

\*Under that same nothing to do with Covid Executive Order, the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) is already considering a rule that would more than double the clean fuels standard and make renewable diesel even more valuable.

\*SB 803 is another mandate. It is unnecessary and will hurt who makes our food, shelter, and clothing - the natural resource industries!
