To Chair Golden and members of the Committee: Re SB 85

My name is Starla Becker-Tillinghast I'm a small farm and woodland owner, 3rd generation at this location. My family is predominantly farmers. I worked on CAFOs for 15 years. I loved it. I support HB 85 for all the reasons and proof listed below.

Oregon is being targeted for our projected climate stability. Large Poultry Integrators from out of state and possibly out of country are trying to come in and exploit our water and take advantage of our lack of protective laws. They do not care about our "waters of the state". They are not family farmers as the Farm Bureau would have you believe. They don't care about our current "family farmers". **They are siting these big barns right next to property lines of long-term residences, with no input from the neighbors. Imagine a "litter shed" in near proximity to your bedroom window!** Big Chicken pays out millions in fines for violations (see below and table). The grower that raises these birds for their 6-week cycle is not in control, and at times is taken advantage of, see further below. <u>220118Evergreen Ranch</u> <u>Site Plans.pdf - Google Drive</u> (check their plans for litter storage). These very large chicken CAFOs are notorious for polluting water and air. Many states have filed lawsuits for damage to their waters, one state in particular, Maryland has proven the damage to water is from air pollution as well. On 2/28/23 We heard there is "report card" reporting as far as the ODA is concerned. **This means the current monitoring gives you a bad grade AFTER YOU DAMAGE the environment!** We only need to look to other states and UK as well, to take lessons already learned from them. **Adequate setbacks, and accounting for poultry manure, and ammonia emissions would prevent this damage.** We must take lessons learned the hard way from other states and use them to guide our lawmaking to preserve the integrity of our state. We don't want to have out-of-state investors take advantage of us. Your time and attention is much appreciated and I respectfully implore us to take a pause on permitting these very large CAFOs until we can keep Oregon protected. **Please support SB 85**

The business model the Broiler industry operates under is unlike other farming in Oregon. The Integrator (Think Tyson, Sanderson Farms, Foster Farms), controls everything from chick to product on our grocery shelves. The grower has the highest risk part and raises the chicks to broiler size. The grower can get into massive debt building these massive barns up to Integrator specs. These same out of state Integrators have been fined millions, for price fixing on the consumer end, underpaying the growers, unsafe labor, and Environmental damage. Oregon is a wonderful agriculturally rich state. Low impact grass seed and hazelnut farming make us sneeze but does not put Nitrogen and Phosphorous in our water making algae overgrowth, and damaging the aquatic life, they do not put massive amounts of Ammonia in the air that becomes Nitrogen and again goes to water. They don't contaminate the ground water we drink. **Though we endure pollen from the grass and hazelnuts they do not release bacteria laden feather dust that these huge chicken CAFOs put out up to 3000 meters distance**. Bill Mattos representative of the Chicken Council says he hasn't seen a paper on this contamination. There are several. Many states have setbacks, to keep these barns away from residences and water. Since we haven't experienced anything this massive before we have no laws in place to protect those of us that already live here. **Churches, Schools, and personal residences have zero protection**, and these several 60x600 ft chicken barns can go in and build up to 50 ft from property lines, remember, they compost the mortalities. This can be 3-5% of total broilers. In 2017 Costco put in barns in Nebraska, and this is comparable to what they want to do here. In cases of bird flu the mortality is 100%.
