the Committee;

As submitted, <u>SECTION 1.</u> of HB 3004 requires The State Department of Energy to submit a report in

the manner provided by ORS 192.245.

ORS 192.245 states, "the requirement shall be met by distribution of an executive summary of no more

than two pages sent to every member of the Legislative Assembly by electronic mail and one copy of

the report to the Legislative Administrator." Wow.... two whole pages!

ORS 192.245 certainly goes a long ways towards explaining why so much of the states green energy

policies boarder on fantasy.

How does one distill the results of a comprehensive study, including cost analysis as well as results

from pilot projects already working down to merely two pages? By disregarding information is my

guess. But the easy answer is that it cannot. And for the State Department of Energy to attempt such a

feat is ludicrous.

For any interim legislative committee to make an informed decision on how the state is going to

regulate energy resource development requires much more information than can be squeezed on to two

pages. Even single spaced.

At the least, the wording of the bill needs to eliminate the reference to ORS 192.245 and simply state

something along the lines of a comprehensive report showing both pros and cons.
