A punchy rodeo that includes a long alley roping setup and local events like the wild horse race and ranch bronc riding. Everyone loves to watch the kids in the calf scramble and the older fellas in the wild cow milking. Breakaway roping brings in more excitement and gets local gals in the arena. The PRCA events bring contestants from around the country who enjoy the challenges of great stock and the long alley for roping. What started in a pasture with a human fence has grown in 75 amazing years to a three-night event bringing in thousands. The Crooked River Roundup earned the "2018 Medium Rodeo of the Year" from the Columbia River Circuit, and wins hearts every year for the sport of rodeo.

Chief Joseph Days

Chief Joseph Days

The tiny town of Joseph swells to ten times its normal size when it welcomes thousands of visitors to Chief Joseph Days. Held the last full week in July since 1946, Chief Joseph Days celebrates the history and culture of the West over six days. Visitors enjoy nightly PRCA rodeos Wednesday through Saturday, starting at 7 p.m. at the Harley Tucker Memorial Arena just off Main Street. Chief Joseph Days has seen its share of recognition. Cowboys & Indians called it a "Best Fest of the West," and it won "Best Medium Size Rodeo" for the Columbia Circuit in 2018. Chief Joseph Days was the only small rodeo to make a Top 10 Must See Rodeos list with the likes of the Pendleton Round-Up. Named for the famous Nez Perce chief, Chief Joseph Days celebrates Nez Perce tribal members from around the region who participate in the Grand Parade down Main Street, and the pre-rodeo show Saturday night. The Nez Perce Friendship Feast is open to the public and features buffalo, salmon and native dancing.

St. Paul Rodeo

The St. Paul Rodeo transforms a town of 425 into the epicenter of professional rodeo during the lucrative 4th of July run or "Cowboy Christmas." The historic St. Paul Rodeo Stadium, constructed in 1944, features Arborvitae trees in the arena offering a truly unique setting. The day after the rodeo local farmers begin planting grass for the St. Paul Buckaroos 1A football team to play in the arena. With \$240,400 in added prize money, the small town of St. Paul ranks in the top 10 of regular season rodeos in the country.

Columbia County Fair & Rodeo



Sisters Rodeo

Awarded the 2019 Large Rodeo of the Year by the Columbia River Circuit, Sisters Rodeo is annually held the second weekend of June in Central Oregon with a spectacular backdrop of the Three Sisters Mountains. The western town of Sisters is just a few miles away, with shopping, fine restaurants and plenty of special events for the entire family during rodeo week. On Saturday morning, visitors and locals alike line the "downtown" streets of this small town to enjoy a great western-style parade of unique and creative entries. Sunday brings Cowboy Church in the arena and the everpopular Kiwanis Buckaroo Pancake Breakfast. The Biggest Little Show in the World is also popularly known as the friendliest rodeo in the world.


Tillamook County Rodeo

The Tillamook County Rodeo is the "Biggest Little Show on the Coast!" The rodeo has occurred annually since 1987 and provides fun for the whole family. Friday night is family night and includes stick pony races and autograph signings with rodeo queens. On Saturday everyone can enjoy the Hooves N' Hops Brewfest before the rodeo. 
