• Oregon needs safe and dignified workplaces that support healthy, thriving communities. At factory farms, workers are often forced into unsafe working conditions and exposed to hazardous chemicals, fumes, and particulate matter.

• Oregon has progressive, humane values. Yet farmed animals in industrialscale settings suffer immensely. In order to economize production for maximum profits, birth, life, and death for animals in factory farms is agony.
