... SECTION 2. There is appropriated to the Oregon Department of Administrative Services, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$_____ for distribution to the Oregon School Activities Association for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of section 1 of this 2023 Act."
