As a cattle producer in close proximity to Oregon, I am opposed to this bill. It will adversely affect Oregon agriculture, Oregon's economy, and subsequently put unnecessary burdens on agriculture in the entire Pacific NW region.

The current permitting program is working...Oregon is not home to "factory farms" or "industrial ag." Oregon agriculture is made of farming and ranching families, most located in the vast, open space of the western part of the state where agriculture is the biggest and most important industry.
