The CAFO permit provides oversight to protect Oregon's water quality.

If SB 85 passed, it would magnify the strain on our food supply chain and further drive up costs for milk, chicken, eggs, beef, and pork. This legislation would only accelerate the loss of family farms and local food production, killing jobs and businesses. As a result, Oregon would have to rely more on out-of-state livestock products and families would pay the price from their diets and their wallets. Please don't be selfish and attack the farmers and businesses in Oregon more than the Oregon legislature already has. Please vote NO on SB-85. Thank you.
