Until this biennium, the program had been underfunded and understaffed, causing critical work on the monitoring, protection, and listing of Oregon's threatened and endangered native plant species to lag.

Native plants have played a critical – if unheralded – role in our economy, environment, and history. They are the source of countless foods, medicines, and materials we use daily (for example, a rare species of meadowfoam was used to develop a valued oil seed). They are the foundation of healthy ecosystems in the state. And, they are an important part of Oregon's history and the cultural heritage of local indigenous peoples. Full funding of the Native Plant Conservation Program will yield benefits now and in the future to Oregonians.
