RE: SB 1016—Establishing Family Support Networks

Chair Gelser Blouin, Vice Chair Robinson, and members of the Committee,

Disability Rights Oregon supports Senate Bill 1016 which codifies the establishment and maintaining a regional family support networks for families of individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities throughout the state.

At Disability Rights Oregon, we see families when they have truly exhausted efforts of working successfully with school districts and other systems. Often times, they have tried to maneuver through advocating for their child without any support whatsoever.

Providing peer delivered supports to families is critical in helping families maneuver through a very complex and difficult systems.

Family support networks provide a critical first step on a parent's journey of how to maneuver through complex systems and providing that supports necessary often relieving family stress, providing information and preventing more challenging modes of resolution such as due process and litigation.

This basic level of support should be added to the legal framework of Oregon. It is much needed throughout the state and every family should have access to peer delivered supports that can facilitate healthy outcomes for our most challenged families.
