*****[HB 3100]** proposed Legislation is a crafted approach and *could be foundational to eliminate* "Water-rights," ground water and individual water wells usages.

[HB 3100] will be expensive and Committee Members are Political Appointees making Public policies.

[HB 3100] states, "...(a) *It is in the interest of the public welfare* that a coordinated, integrated state water resources policy *be formulated and means provided for its enforcement*, that plans and programs for the development and enlargement of the water resources of this state be devised and promoted and that other activities *designed to encourage, promote and secure the maximum beneficial use and control* of such water resources and the development of additional water supplies be carried out by a single state agency that, in carrying out its functions, *shall give proper and adequate consideration to the multiple aspects of the beneficial use and control of such water resources* with an impartiality of interest <u>except that designed to best protect and promote the public welfare generally</u>."

"The development and implementation of place-based integrated water resources strategies." see [HB 3163 (2023)]

[HB 3100] states, "...B) The **formation** of *task groups, work groups or advisory groups to advance specific recommended actions*. (C) Declarations of cooperation between diverse water stakeholders that describe the stakeholders' individual and collective commitment to advance specific recommended actions in a balanced and integrated manner. (h) How to support implementation of priority actions recommended in other relevant state-developed or state-recognized plans or strategies, including but not limited to *placebased integrated water resources strategies*." see **[HB 3163 (2023)]**

[HB 3100] states, "...(8) *To prioritize and implement actions* recommended by the integrated state water resources strategy, the Water Resources Department *shall coordinate with implementing partners*, the Integrated State Water Resources Strategy Advisory Committee described in section 2 of this 2023 Act, the Environmental Quality Commission, the State Department of Agriculture and the State Department of Fish and Wildlife *to develop a biennial work plan*, *which must be informed by biennial listening sessions in regions across the state*."

[HB 3100] states, "...SECTION 2. (1) The Integrated *State Water Resources Strategy Advisory Committee* is established *as an advisory committee* to the *Water Resources Commission* and the *Water Resources Department* for the purposes of advising on, and supporting implementation of and [3] updates to, the integrated state water resources strategy described in ORS 536.220 and assisting with the following as they relate to the integrated state water resources strategy..."

[HB 3100] states, "...(2) *The commission* shall determine *the number of members of the committee and appoint members of the committee* who represent a balance of in-stream and out-of-stream interests and a balance of state-level and local-level organizations, including but not limited to tribes, conservation groups, groups representing irrigation interests, groups representing municipal interests, environmental justice organizations, local governments and state agencies."
