My name is Troy Gulstrom and I live in the Santiam Canyon Area. Even though I was not personally harmed by the Fires of September 2020, seven families in my church lost their homes and everything they owned except for the clothes on their back. Since early on, I have had the honor to serve on two citizen led committees helping to guide the rebuild of our communities in the Santiam Canyon. Even within our own state agencies we have seen dollars promised and never released. To say people are frustrated is an understatement. Then they get their property tax bill and see huge increases. It seems to be one gut-punch after another.

Thank you Rep. Ed Diehl for introducing this bill to give relief to people who have gone through so much in the last 2 1/2 yrs. Please vote yes to pass this bill in committee and on the floor. The people of Oregon deserve this tax relief.
