I would like to state my strong support for Ranked Choice Voting in Oregon. RCV firstly provides greater choice and candidate viability to Oregon voters. There is no such thing as a "wasted vote." RCV is also known as "instant run-off" voting, because preferences are taken into account in a systematic process, so a separate election with only two candidates is not needed.
