in support of SB 1068.

Under current laws and statutes, a property owner can choose not to be in a Rural Fire Protection

District.

I want to address what I believe is a key objection to this legislation. That is the attitude some have of

"Just bill me for the service if I need it and use your service". If everyone were to take that stance; what

service would exist for these property owners to call? What service would exist for anyone to call? The

answer is: No service would exist. There would no one to call when someone was trapped, bleeding to

death, in a mangled car, and they needed someone to not only make every professional effort to

stabilize them medically, but also to cut them out of that car with the Jaws of Life. Who will extinguish

the flames of the car on fire with people trapped inside? What trained individuals would respond in any

number of fire, medical, or life threatening emergencies without a tax base to fund the existence of

these programs? Are we supposed to have multiple subscription services for emergency services, with

neighbors subscribing to different services? Anyone who thinks about this situation rationally must

realize and admit there is no way for any emergency services to exist without everyone participating in

the tax base.

Make no mistake about it, modern fire districts, and all the dedicated men and women who are working

for those districts, are much more than firefighters. They are emergency service providers. From

emergency medical services, often arriving before ambulances, to automobile wreck extraction and

rescues from all sorts of life threatening situations, today's firefighters perform a broad range of

services. All of them vital to a person in need.

Most of all, they are there when needed because of the tax-based funding that supports them.

Please do your part to support emergency services for all by ensuring that all participate in the funding.
