The Portland Parks Foundation (PPF) supports the creation of a more financially sustainable future for Portland Parks and Recreation (PPR). We believe the best means to this end is a robust community discussion to explore all the best possible options. For this reason, PPF supports pursuit of HB 3515 at this time to create the *opportunity* for Portland's Council to oversee a future parks district. We believe this option should be weighed by the community along with the other existing parks district governance options: oversight by the county or by an independent board.
