RE: House Bill 3198 and proposed amendment to merge HB 3454

Chair Neron, Vice-Chair Hudson, Vice-Chair Wright and members of the Education Committee:

I am pleased to submit this letter sharing the impact of current investments in Central Oregon as you consider House Bill 3198 and proposed amendment to merge HB 3454 and HB 3198 to expand early learning and literacy services through the Department of Early Learning and Care (DELC).

Funding from the Kindergarten Partnership and Innovation (KPI) and Early Learning Equity Fund currently support services to 2200 children across the region with emphasis on traditionally underserved populations. Current efforts include school readiness program Juntos Aprendemos for emerging English language/bilingual students and families; frontier school readiness program for Post/Paulina upper country; access to books for rural children birth to school age; UpStart, an online school readiness program where other services are not available; and, work with tribal Papalaxsimisha program to promote native language and culturally appropriate early literacy services for Warm Springs families. Professional development investments support Social Emotional and Growth Mindset training and coaching for regional early learning and K-3 leaders and implementation of the regional Early Learning Conference annually.

A Paulina parent recently shared her appreciation in being able to co-design options for her 4 year old entering the frontier K-8 school in the coming year. "Thank you for listening to the needs of this special community. We definitely need some options to help get our kiddos ready and excited to learn in Kindergarten."

An expansion of KPI and Equity Funds in Central Oregon would accelerate our efforts to provide literacy and school readiness services and expand transition services to Kindergarten for up to 1000 additional underserved children and families. Thank you for your thoughtful consideration.
