My name is Michael Huntington. I am a retired radiation oncologist and, for 22 years, was the Medical Director of the Samaritan Regional Cancer Center in Corvallis. I am a Board Member of Mid-Valley Health Care Advocates, the Oregon Chapter of Physicians for a National Health Program, and One Payer States.

Before I retired in 2006, I witnessed a disturbing pattern. Patients were coming in with advanced cancers because they had delayed care. Even though they knew they had a serious illness, they were too afraid to seek medical attention because of the cost. They did not want to risk their savings, home, and family for healthcare costs.

- 1. Our unaffordable inefficient healthcare system must be reformed, and it is the responsibility of elected officials to figure out how to do this.
- 2. In 2022, Oregonians passed a constitutional amendment making healthcare a right for every Oregonian.
- 3. Establishing the Governance Board and funding their work will give you the specific details and information you need next session as you confront the tough issue of healthcare reform.
- 4. The work outlined in SB 1089 will support you on the path to closing the coverage gap and achieving healthcare equity and justice.
