I support the forthcoming -3 Amendment (and the policy recommendations offered by the Just Crossing Alliance) that ensures this replacement bridge project moves forward smoothly with explicit pro-labor provisions, finance guardrails, and major investments in mass transit.

\$7 billion is a crazy amount to spend, and lying about a bridge replacement when we're doing a massive freeway widening is gross.
