Over 40,000 additional people passed through our facility last year to attend a conference, training, wedding, celebration of life, to watch a performance in our theater, go through our museum or enjoy our Japanese Garden. With the continued growth of the Four Rivers Cultural Center and Museum we have become an important source of jobs and economic growth in our area. In the last 3 years we have gone from 4-5 employees to 12-14 employees. With additional funding, we could create more jobs and stimulate economic growth, which would benefit not only our community, but the entire state.

Again, with this funding for the arts and other programs for the underserved youth in our community you could help level the playing field for our City and County. You could help us make a difference in our community. This is exactly what capital funding requests are about. We are the poorest county in the state and granting us this funding is not only equitable, but true social justice at work, benefiting our hard-working families and children. We desperately need capital improvements, and this would be essential to continue our financial stability and our ability to provide low-cost or free programming to our community.
