RE: Support of Fair Funding Bills SB-451 & HB 2510

Dear Co-Chair Steiner, Co-Chair Sanchez and Honorable Committee Members,

My name is Steve Holliday from Central Oregon, more specifically Powell Butte. I am the President of the Crooked River Round-up in Prineville. Thank you for the opportunity to provide testimony regarding County Fair Funding Bills SB-451 and HB-2510. Approval of these bills removes the cap of \$1.5 million shared by Oregon State Fair, Oaks Park and 34 other county fairgrounds per year and returns the 1% of lottery funding direct allocation for fairgrounds to counties. I encourage your support of these similar bills.

Having grown up in Eastern Oregon and now living in Central Oregon, I believe that the fairgrounds serve as an economic hub for most rural communities. Fairgrounds have always been the economic hub for rural communities. Future generations will come to appreciate, utilize and preserve the fairgrounds. Even as our society changes, the fairgrounds serves as a hub-common ground for all citizens of rural communities.
