I am writing on behalf of the United Way of the Mid-Willamette Valley, to support the Barbara Roberts Career Technical Education Center (CTEC) in Sheridan, Oregon, and its application to the legislature for \$12 million in construction funds.

The United Way is in partnership with the Barbara Roberts CTEC Development Team and Sheridan School District for the development of several CTE programs: Fire Science, Automotive and Heavy Equipment - Truck, Logistics & Diesel Mechanics, Manufacturing Technology – Manufacturing, and Agribusiness-Sustainable Plant Science and Technology. These programs will prepare our future workforce for high-wage, high-demand Jobs in our local industry.

We understand that the development of Barbara Roberts CTEC requires strong partnerships that will inform and direct as programs of study are developed. Our contribution will be in the form of financial, in-kind, materials and/or expertise and may expand throughout implementation of the project.
