The car driver said he never saw her until she went up on his hood after he hit her motorcycle at full speed knocking it away. The road conditions were clear and dry, This happened around nine AM on a lovely Sunday morning on the Banfield hwy with no cars to our front and only his car near behind us.

I'm sharing this with you hoping you will look at this important bill with the safety of thousands of motorcyclists that are on our highways. Passing this bill will give motorcycles another tool and means to move more safely through traffic especially in these times when we see so many vehicle operators being distracted by mobile devices as they drive on our congested roads and freeways.
