HB 3382 is absurd. The fact that it was even introduced demonstrates irresponsible governance by the sponsors and supporting legislators. This legislation is designed to give Ports the ability to circumvent the laws and rules of the State and do whatever the hell they want with no accountability. Allowing this legislation to proceed is not only irrational, it verges on insane. Creating a precedent wherein governmental entities are allowed to evade the laws put in place to protect the citizen and the environment, because it knows it cannot meet those laws is simply an appalling and very dangerous idea.
