I am opposed to SB166. I am concerned when the Sec of State decides to create a bill that limits whether the people can not only ask questions, but obtain information that is considered public knowledge. Nothing that people are asking for is considered private information.

Please note Nobody is asking to see how or for whom one voted for, but just who voted. The fact is that voter rolls are "dirty " or inaccurate. Names cannot be verified to belong to an actual person except by canvassing door to door. (consider the bots on Twitter).
