

HB 2048 -2, -3 STAFF MEASURE SUMMARY

WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Directs Health Licensing office to establish process to issue provisional registration to applicant for behavior analysis interventionist registration. Requires provisional registration to be issued within five days of receipt of application. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

FISCAL: May have fiscal impact, but no statement yet issued.

REVENUE: May have revenue impact, but no statement yet issued.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Impact of delays in behavior analysis interventionist registration decisions

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

-2 Clarifies parameters of provisional registration. Moves up operative date to October 1, 2023.

FISCAL: Has minimal fiscal impact

REVENUE: No revenue impact

-3 Requires Health Licensing Office to contract with third party to conduct study on access to behavior analysis interventionists and report back to Legislative Assembly by September 15, 2024.

FISCAL: Fiscal impact issued

REVENUE: No revenue impact

BACKGROUND:

Applied behavior analysis (ABA) is a type of interpersonal therapy often used in the treatment of children diagnosed with autism spectrum disorder (ASD). ABA focuses on changing behaviors by understanding what happens before and after the behavior.

In 2013, the Legislative Assembly passed Senate Bill 365, creating the Behavioral Analysis Regulatory Board (BARB) within the Health Licensing Office (HLO). The measure also required the BARB to establish criteria for the licensing of behavior analysts and assistant behavior analysts and registration of behavior analysis interventionists.

House Bill 2048 would direct the Health Licensing Office to issue a provisional registration to behavior analysis interventionist registration applicants when approval of registration does not occur within five days.
