- HB 4088 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Requires hospitals to take certain actions with respect to protecting hospital employees from workplace assaults.
- HB 4135 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Creates the crime of threatening a mass injury event.

- HB 4088 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Requires hospitals to take certain actions with respect to protecting hospital employees from workplace assaults.
- HB 4097
Modifies the process for setting aside convictions, dismissals and guilty except for insanity judgments.
- HB 4122
Provides that a person's participation in the Department of State Police's fingerprint retention program authorizes the department to submit the person's fingerprints to the Federal Bureau of Investigation's rap back system.
- HB 4135 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Creates the crime of threatening a mass injury event.
- HB 4140 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Appropriates moneys to the Department of Justice to fund certain programs that assist victims of crime.

HB 4145 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Creates the crime of using an animal in a display of animal crushing.

HB 4146
Provides that a petition for a Family Abuse Prevention Act order, Elderly Persons and Persons with Disabilities Abuse Prevention Act order or sexual abuse restraining order may be filed in the county in which the abuse occurred.

HB 4156
Modifies definitions pertaining to stalking orders and stalking offenses.

HB 4160
Modifies the length of time by which a person is considered a student for purposes of determining if conduct is prohibited sexual conduct.
