FURNITURE BANK

- **37** referring social service agencies
- 28 homes furnished per month
- Service gap: **70+** families per month

Salem Alliance Church Furniture Bank (Salem and Keizer)



- **60** referring social service agencies
- **50** homes furnished per month
- Service gap: 14 rural counties need services

Furnish Hope (Bend and Central Oregon)



- **160** referring social service agencies
- 220 homes furnished per month
- Service gap: **170+** families per month

Increased Demand for Furniture Banks



increase in demand from **2020-2023** (35% in 2022-2023)



estimated # of Oregonians annually who are living without most or all of the furniture they need



cost savings to furnish a 1-bedroom home through a furniture bank rather than purchasing items

Furniture Bank Limitations:

- Funding
- Awareness
- Warehouse space
- Dignity-condition furnishings, especially mattresses, bedding, and dressers
