Subject: HB 4140 – Relating to victims
Work Session Recommendations

The measure directs the Department of Justice (DOJ) to include discrete amounts in its budget request for the next biennium that are necessary for funding the projected costs of state support for children's advocacy centers, the Survivor Housing Funds Grant program, its successor program, and the Oregon Domestic and Sexual Violence Services Fund. Allows the amounts to include a maximum of 10 percent for DOJ's administrative costs. Directs children's advocacy centers to submit reports to the DOJ in even numbered years for projected costs of operation for the next biennium, along with estimates of funding from all other sources. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A fiscal impact statement, and revenue impact statement are available on the Oregon Legislative Information System. There is no amendment to the measure.
