WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Requires car sharing arrangements in Oregon to include insurance coverage. Apportions responsibility for the coverage between the car sharing program operator, the shared vehicle owner, and the shared vehicle driver. Specifies certain disclosures that car sharing agreements must include. Requires shared vehicle owner to address recall notices for defects that affect the safety of the vehicle.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

No amendment.

BACKGROUND:

The term "peer-to-peer car sharing" refers to a type of lending or collaborative consumption in which a vehicle owner shares their vehicle with another individual for an agreed-upon period of time. Such arrangements can be created between individuals (the vehicle owner and the vehicle driver) or may include a car club or peer-to-peer car sharing company through a phone application. The peer-to-peer company option also has two general options: fleet-based car sharing, where the company owns the fleet of vehicles that are listed on the app platform; or companies that simply facilitate transactions between vehicle owners and vehicle drivers.
