### **HIGHER EDUCATION COORDINATING COMMISSION**

The Governor has appointed the following individuals to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission subject to Senate confirmation.<sup>1</sup>

#### **New Appointees**

ORS 350.050 (2023)

### Statement of Economic Interest<sup>2</sup>

Required.

### **Composition**<sup>3</sup>

The commission consists of 15 Oregon residents serving as voting members who are well informed concerning the principles of higher education. Membership includes:

- one public university undergraduate student (ARNOT);
- one public university graduate student (SIPELII);
- one public university faculty member (SIMNITT);
- one community college student (BISCOE);
- one community college faculty member (ROJAS-GALVÁN);
- one public university or community college nonfaculty staff member (MATIAS);
- one member from each of the six congressional districts<sup>4</sup> (FAJARDO (CD1), YAMASAKI (CD2), KOCHER CD3), HAMANN (CD4), PROCTER ANDREWS (CD5), DEVLIN (CD6)); and
- three members of the general public<sup>5</sup> (ADAMS, **MARTINEZ**, ROWE).

The Governor shall elicit recommendations for student, faculty, and staff appointees. Appointees from the congressional districts and from the general public serve four-year terms and the remainder serve two-year terms. All members are eligible for reappointment. The Governor may, for cause, remove any member after notice and a public hearing, but not more than three members shall be removed within a period of four years, unless it is for corrupt conduct in office.<sup>6</sup>

The commission selects its chair and vice chair. A majority of the members constitutes a quorum. The commission must meet at least once every three months.<sup>7</sup>

#### Duties<sup>8</sup>

The commission works to ensure access to post-secondary education and academic success. The commission must:

- establish educational attainment goals for adults not currently enrolled in a postsecondary training program, in coordination with the State Workforce and Talent Development Board;
- appoint an executive director;
- develop goals for post-secondary education, including community colleges and public universities, and for student access programs;
- determine strategic investments, and adopt a strategic plan, to achieve goals;
- coordinate post-secondary data collection and structure;
- recommend a consolidated higher education agency request;
- adopt rules governing the distribution of appropriations;
- approve or deny any significant change to the academic program of a community college or public university;
- approve mission statements adopted by public universities; review specified fee increases; advise the Governor and the Legislative Assembly about university governance issues; and authorize degrees offered by independent postsecondary institutions;
- oversee the licensing of career schools;
- administer a statewide longitudinal data system; conduct longitudinal studies; and report on early learning, kindergarten through Grade 12 education, higher education, and workforce programs, in coordination with the Department of Education, the Employment Department, and other state agencies;
- implement a review process for, and appropriately act on, student complaints;

- advise the Governor and the Legislative Assembly, community colleges, public universities, and other state boards and commissions on specified policies;
- ensure the implementation of diverse educator recruitment plans;
- make specified reports to the Legislative Assembly;
- work with institutions of higher education to achieve specified goals and appoint an advisory committee to coordinate implementation;
- administer specified funds and grant programs and adopt administrative rules;
- monitor and report on participation of specified groups in higher education;
- conduct annual reviews of each public institution of higher education with respect to the employment of all employee groups at the institution; and
- develop standards for transferring and awarding education credits, in consultation with community colleges and public universities.

The commission may:

- establish advisory and technical committees and delegate powers, duties, or functions to a committee or the executive director;
- enter into contracts and agreements and adopt administrative rules;
- refer to a designee the investigation and resolution of a student complaint, as appropriate, due to the nature and content of any allegations made;
- accept donated money or property, apply for funding from any source, and accept and arrange for the receipt of donations as appropriate; and
- prescribe tests and other measures to evaluate high school equivalency tests.
