WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

The measure requires the Higher Education Coordinating Commission (HECC) to establish and administer a grant program to expand the scope and reach of college access and success programs. Eligible organizations include nonprofit organizations, community-based organizations, and public institutions of higher education.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Ability to build capacity and scale programs
- Ability for programs to compete for funding
- Impact on first generation and low income students

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

No amendment.

BACKGROUND:

The 2021-2023 and 2023-2025 legislative budgets both included a \$5 million appropriation to HECC to award grants to programs assisting students with access to post-secondary education opportunities. The budget reports for those measures, House Bill 5006 (2021) and House Bill 5006 (2021) and House Bill 5006 (2021) and House Bill 5006 (2023), note that the appropriations were intended for distribution in amounts of \$1 million to five programs or organizations: Access to Student Assistance Programs in Reach of Everyone (ASPIRE), College Possible, Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID), BUILD EXITO at Portland State University, and the Oregon TRIO Association.

<u>House Bill 3120 (2023)</u>, as amended, would have required HECC to establish a grant program to award funds to college access and success programs to eligible organizations. House Bill 4163 reintroduces the provisions of House Bill 3120 (2023) that established that grant program.
