Summary of Revenue Changes

Senate Bill 1503 includes a one-time \$250,000 General Fund appropriation to the Department of Justice (DOJ) to pay a third party for research ordered by the Task Force on Community Safety and Firearm Suicide Prevention.

Summary of Public Safety Subcommittee Action

The measure establishes the 17-member Task Force on Community Safety and Firearm Suicide Prevention, which is to study specific issues related to public health best practices for reducing deaths from community safety threats and for suicide prevention. The measure requires the Task Force to study specific issues required by the measure and coordinate with DOJ, Oregon Health Authority (OHA), sheriff departments providing voluntary storage of firearms, federally recognized Indian Tribes in Oregon, faith-based groups in Oregon, and the Oregon Alliance to Prevent Suicide. The Task Force is required to submit reports to the Interim Committees of the Legislative Assembly related to health care by September 15, 2024, and September 15, 2025. The Task Force sunsets on December 31, 2026.

The measure directs DOJ to provide staff support for the Task Force, which the agency states can absorb within existing resources. All other participating Task Force members are expected to have a minimal fiscal impact.

The Subcommittee approved, on a time-time basis, a General Fund appropriation of \$250,000 to DOJ for the purpose of paying a third party for research ordered by the Task Force.
