

# Senate Bill 1530

Printed pursuant to Senate Interim Rule 213.28 by order of the President of the Senate in conformance with pre-session filing rules, indicating neither advocacy nor opposition on the part of the President (at the request of Senate Interim Committee on Housing and Development)

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**. The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: Gives money to OHCS, OHA, DHS, DOE and DAS for programs. Goes into effect when the Governor signs it. (Flesch Readability Score: 81.4).

Appropriates moneys to the Housing and Community Services Department, Oregon Health Authority, Department of Human Services, State Department of Energy and Oregon Department of Administrative Services for various programs.

Declares an emergency, effective on passage.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to state financial administration; and declaring an emergency.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropri-**  
5 **ated to the Housing and Community Services Department, for deposit into the General**  
6 **Housing Account under ORS 458.620, for the biennium ending June 30, 2025, out of the Gen-**  
7 **eral Fund, the following amounts:**

8 (1) **\$65,000,000 for the operations, services and administration of emergency shelters, as**  
9 **defined in ORS 197.782.**

10 (2) **\$40,000,000 for homelessness prevention services delivered through the Oregon**  
11 **Eviction Diversion and Prevention and Eviction Prevention Rapid Response programs.**

12 (3) **\$20,000,000 to implement the Affordable Housing Land Acquisition Revolving Loan**  
13 **Program under ORS 456.502.**

14 (4) **\$15,000,000 to provide a flexible funding source to allow for alternative ownership**  
15 **models, including co-ops, as well as affordable single-family housing.**

16 (5) **\$5,000,000 to provide matching funds to individual development accounts under ORS**  
17 **458.670 to 458.700 for accounts established for the purchase of a primary residence.**

18 **SECTION 2. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropri-**  
19 **ated to the Oregon Health Authority, for the biennium ending June 30, 2025, out of the**  
20 **General Fund, the following amounts:**

21 (1) **\$30,000,000 for deposit into the Drug Treatment and Recovery Services Fund under**  
22 **ORS 430.384.**

23 (2) **\$3,500,000 to provide air conditioners and air filters under ORS 431A.430.**

24 **SECTION 3. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropri-**  
25 **ated to the Department of Human Services, for the biennium ending June 30, 2025, out of the**  
26 **General Fund, the amount of \$5,000,000, to provide grants for warming or cooling emergency**  
27 **shelters or facilities as described in ORS 431A.410.**

**NOTE:** Matter in **boldfaced** type in an amended section is new; matter *[italic and bracketed]* is existing law to be omitted. New sections are in **boldfaced** type.

1       **SECTION 4.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropri-  
2       ated to the State Department of Energy, for the biennium ending June 30, 2025, out of the  
3       General Fund, the amount of \$5,000,000 for deposit into the Residential Heat Pump Fund  
4       under section 21, chapter 86, Oregon Laws 2022.

5       **SECTION 5.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropri-  
6       ated to the Oregon Department of Administrative Services, for the biennium ending June 30,  
7       2025, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$1,000,000, to provide one or more grants to a  
8       nonprofit organization to donate reused household goods and furnishings to low-income res-  
9       idents across this state.

10       **SECTION 6.** This 2024 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public  
11       peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2024 Act takes effect  
12       on its passage.
