CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

2 Whereas Bill Bradbury was born on May 29, 1949, in Chicago, Illinois, to William and Lorraine
3 Bradbury; and

4 Whereas Bill Bradbury moved to Oregon in 1969, where he worked in the news media in Bandon,
5 Eugene and Portland; and

6 Whereas Bill Bradbury's political career began when he was elected to the Oregon Legislative
7 Assembly in 1980; and

8 Whereas Bill Bradbury served as a member of the House of Representatives from 1981 to 1984
9 and as a member of the Senate from 1985 to 1995; and

10 Whereas in 1981, during his first session as a member of the House of Representatives, Bill
11 Bradbury sponsored and worked to pass legislation creating the Salmon and Trout Enhancement
12 Program, empowering Oregonians to contribute to the recovery and sustainability of Oregon's pop-
13 ulation of native salmon and trout; and

14 Whereas in 1983, Bill Bradbury worked with the Oregon Community College Association to pass
15 legislation creating Small Business Development Centers at community colleges throughout Oregon,
16 giving entrepreneurs in Oregon their best shot at success; and

17 Whereas more than 40 years later, the programs created by these two crucial pieces of legis-
18 lation are still enriching the lives of Oregonians today; and

19 Whereas Bill Bradbury was elected Senate President in 1993; and

20 Whereas Bill Bradbury retired from the Legislative Assembly in 1995 to fight the shrinking of
21 salmon populations with the organization For the Sake of Salmon; and

22 Whereas Bill Bradbury, known then as "Mr. Fish," served as director of For the Sake of Salmon
23 until 1999; and

24 Whereas in 1999, Bill Bradbury was appointed Oregon's 23rd Secretary of State by Governor
25 John Kitzhaber; and

26 Whereas Bill Bradbury served as Secretary of State for a decade, with a sharp focus on im-
27 proving Oregon's voting systems and establishing more transparent campaign practices; and

28 Whereas Bill Bradbury was diagnosed with multiple sclerosis in 1981 and managed the disease

1 through more than four decades of rigorous public service with unflagging enthusiasm and gratitude;
2 and

3 Whereas Bill Bradbury ran for Governor in 2010 with a series of witty campaign ads highlight-
4 ing his condition instead of hiding it; and

5 Whereas Bill Bradbury's efforts to improve the lives of Oregonians led to the creation of
6 Oregon's statewide vote-by-mail system, the first in the country providing voters with easier access
7 to voting, increased transparency and renewed faith that their votes mattered; and

8 Whereas Bill Bradbury also helped establish ORESTAR, Oregon's online political campaign
9 contributions system, which makes campaign finance information easily accessible by the public; and

10 Whereas Bill Bradbury was a fierce champion for the environment, advocating for the preser-
11 vation of watersheds and wildlife habitats, giving lectures on climate change at Oregon high schools
12 and colleges, and serving on the Northwest Power and Conservation Council from 2010 to 2017; and

13 Whereas Bill Bradbury died on April 14, 2023, while enjoying a six-month cruise around the
14 world with his wife of 36 years, Katy Eymann; and

15 Whereas Bill Bradbury faced all of life's challenges with hope, resilience and relentless opti-
16 mism; and

17 Whereas Bill Bradbury leaves behind a legacy that will endure for generations to come; now,
18 therefore,

19 **Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:**

20 That we, the members of the Eighty-second Legislative Assembly, celebrate the life and accom-
21 plishments of Bill Bradbury, and we recognize and honor his contributions to the people of this
22 state; and be it further

23 Resolved, That a copy of this resolution shall be presented to the family of Bill Bradbury as an
24 expression of our great appreciation for his remarkable life of service to the State of Oregon.
