Chair Kropf, Vice-Chairs Anderson and Wallan, and members of the committee,

Thank you for the opportunity to submit testimony on behalf of the Oregon Nurses Association. The Oregon Nurses Association (ONA) is a professional association and labor union representing over 17,000 nurses and healthcare professionals across Oregon. Our members work in urban and rural hospitals, clinics, school-based health centers, home health, and county health departments.

Sexual Assault Nurse Examiners (SANE nurses) provide supportive and sensitive care for patients who have just experienced sexual assault. While treating patients, they gather evidence for rape kits and testify in court about the survivor's injuries. Research shows SANEs provide high quality care: they take patient concerns seriously, they believe and respect patients, and they provide useful follow-up information.¹ They are also valuable within our justice system: SANE nurses made it more likely that adult sexual assault cases were investigated and prosecuted.² SANE nurses provide high quality health care and are important allies within the justice system.

In Oregon, SANE nurses are licensed, trained, and supported by the SANE Certification Commission. With adequate and stable funding, the Commission will be able to support a fulltime coordinator, who will lead the Commission and the SANE nurses they support. ONA urges a yes vote. Thank you for considering these comments.
