The National Alliance for Drug Endangered Children (National DEC) exists to help make a difference in the lives of children who are being impacted by their caregiver's substance misuse or addiction by bringing professionals and communities together to address the issue in unprecedented ways.

We support Senator Knopp's legislative concept because it helps in several ways.

- **Increasing the permanent funding.** We need to get more resources into the hands of Child Advocacy Centers (CACs) in Oregon who are already doing great work.
- **Competitive grants.** Supporting underserved, rural, high-risk children with targeted resources to CACs.
- **A workgroup and study.** This will create space for feedback about what's working and what can be done to increase resources and services.
