Physical health and mental health are interconnected aspects of a student's overall development, and mental health challenges have been on the rise for our students, impacting their ability to focus, learn and succeed. However, the current level of funding falls short of meeting the growing demand for these essential services.

Raising funding for SBHCs in line with inflation will help ensure our students have access to the comprehensive care they need to thrive physically, emotionally and academically. Adding funding for SBHCs to expand their mental health services will help to fill a marked need and provide our community's youth the services they need now more than ever, so they can succeed in school and in life.

Our youth need this help now, and these resources will allow for an immediate increase in our school-based health centers' capacity to support them. I urge you to vote yes on HB 4070.
