If it were amended to remove the provision for expedited UGB expansion I could support it.

A expedited UGB expansion process will do nothing to address the underlying issues that SB1537 is attempting to address.

One only needs to compare housing costs in Oregon to comparable areas in adjacent states to realize that our current UGB process is not the problem, indeed it may be one of the reasons that housing costs in Oregon are consistently lower than in adjacent states that do not have UGB's.

Poorly thought out and considered UGB expansions will only make our communities increasingly inefficient and increase unnecessary use of our tax dollars in the future. In addition to permanantly removing irreplaceable resource land.

Our housing issues can easily be solved by other means. Particularly investing in infrastructure that facilitates efficient use of bare and underutilized land within our current UGB's.
